Through hands-on activities, they will examine the arguments, conflicts, and decisions that shaped the founding of the nation.

**What students will do:**

- Put the British soldiers of the Boston Massacre on trial
- Print pro- and anti-Stamp Act pamphlets
- Map and analyze the 27 grievances in the Declaration of Independence
- Participate in a "Should We Declare Independence?" debate
- Create short-form videos ("Declaration Shorts") explaining its key ideas
- Visit the Wisconsin State Capitol to explore republican government and liberty
